Policies, Standards, and Information

Policy Issues

Our desire is for you to have a rewarding work experience while at Marannook. Marannook is a ministry and a non-profit business in that we have people who pay to come. Therefore, we seek to honor God by being excellent and professional in everything. That is why we have our policies.

Dress Policy

Our dress standards are based on the biblical standard of modesty. Please see the policy included.

Speech Policy

The use of our tongue (speech) is an important emphasis at Marannook. We expect you to be honest in everything and to build each other up (edify). If you have a problem with someone else, the bible instructs us to first go to that person and that person only. If you can't resolve it with that person, you are to go to your supervisor. If you have a problem with your supervisor, you are to go to them first. If at that point the matter is still unresolved, go to Matt Sewell or Sid Baxter..

Cell Phones

This year cell phones will be allowed to occasionally call home and check email and messages. We can check sites visited through routers and WiFi throughout camp at our discretion and, if deemed necessary, be sent home.

Leave at Home

Gambling, smoking, alcohol, or firearms of any kind are not allowed on camp property. There will be a lights-out/quiet hours policy. You'll be asked to abide by these because rest is essential to you and others. Because you will be living with others, we ask that you respect them, and yourself, by managing your belongings well and respecting others' belongings.

Attitude

While you're at Marannook, we expect you to have a Christ-like attitude. One that is serving and not self-seeking. If you are not feeling well or find it challenging to do your job, speak with your supervisor.

Guy/Girl Relationships

At Marannook, we expect all of your relationships with the opposite sex to be above reproach. This means that there should be no question about the purity of your relationships. You are not to show unequal attention to anyone, but get to know and interact with everyone equally. We want you to have the mindset of finding ways to bless and encourage others and not interact in ways that could be interpreted as flirting.

- ~You are not allowed to be alone with the opposite sex. 2:1 should always be followed.
- ~The guys are to treat each girl respectfully and treat all girls equally. Girls should also reciprocate this.
- ~The opposite sex living space is off-limits.

Automobiles

If you bring a car, be sure before you come that it is in good mechanical working order and has good tires with correct air pressure. Also, make sure your driver's license is current and you have auto insurance Money

Travel expenses to and from camp and the occasional outing (Walmart) will be covered by you. It's in your best interest to have the ability to pay electronically, so you aren't carrying cash.

Visitors

Our work at Camp Marannook is highly scheduled, and we want each staff member to use extra time to get to know the other staff members. If you would like someone to visit at camp, you must get the approval of a camp director at least three days in advance. Your supervisor or other Marannook Program Staff has the right to deny a guest from coming or ask them to leave at any point. Your guest will be expected to follow all of Marannook's policies while on the property.

Medications

If you have medications, please bring a supply for the time you will be at Marannook or a copy of your prescriptions if needed. If you wear contacts, make sure you have a good supply of all agents (local drug stores might not carry the brands you use) and an extra pair of contacts, a pair of glasses, or your contact prescription.

Packing List

Remember, space is limited! Pack enough but not too much.

1. Depending on the duration of your stay, bring an adequate supply of clothing (including a Sunday outfit if applicable). **These must meet the Dress Policy standard!** If questionable, it is best to leave it at home because you will be asked to change. We have washers and dryers to do your laundry.

Items to remember:

- Multiple pairs of underwear and socks
- Tennis shoes
- A bathing suit
- Athletic shorts
- 10 or so T-shirts
- A belt
- 5-8 pairs of shorts or pants
- Khaki shorts
- A light jacket or sweatshirt
- A watch (good to have a cheap and waterproof one!)
- A set of dress clothes (guys need a tie with dress shirts)
- Towels and toiletries for your stay
- Bed linens and/or sleeping bag for your bunk
- Cell phone if you have one (if you don't, you can use the camp phone to call home)
- Bible and any journal
- Personal flashlight(as well as extra batteries)
- Optional: musical instruments/song sheets (we'd love to hear va!)
- Laundry bag

Gentlemen's Dress Policy

Shirts:

- Shirts with sleeves.
- Loose-fitting.
- Shirts are worn at all times except when swimming.
- You might want to bring a light jacket, sweatshirt, or a long-sleeve button-down shirt.

Shorts/Pants:

- Wear a belt if there are belt loops.
- Shorts must come to mid-thigh or below fingertips, whichever is longer.
- No holes, cut-offs, or frayed hems.
- No mesh gym shorts.
- Nothing too tight.
- No sagging.
- Bring at least one pair of khaki shorts.

Shoes:

- Sandals may be worn but must have a back strap.
- Tennis shoes or hiking boots (with toes and heels covered).
- No flip-flops (except at the pool).

Sundays:

- Dress pants must meet the standards under "Short/Pants."
- Bring a dress shirt and a "polo" style shirt..
- Appropriate shoes and socks.

Swimsuits:

- Wear swimsuits of the boxer variety.
- Wear at normal hip level.
- No speedos.

Hair:

- Hair level in front must be at the eyebrows or above. Hair level in the back must be above the collar
- Must be clean-shaven or have a well-maintained beard.
- No hats or caps worn inside or on Manna Deck when eating.

Jewelry/Piercings/Tattoos:

- No jewelry or body piercings.
- Visible tattoos or brandings must be covered during camper weeks.

Packing:

• Bring only clothes that meet the Male Dress Policy Standards.
